About Your Tour Host

Robert Resnik has been a part of Burlington's acoustic music scene for more than 35 years, and plays more than 25 different musical instruments. He has hosted *All The Traditions* on VPR since 1996, and led five previous folk music tours with VPR travelers.

Robert loves button accordions, Neolithic stone circles, eating fine chocolates, and hunting for wild mushrooms. That's all in his spare time. Robert has been a full-time librarian at the Fletcher Free Library, Burlington's public library, since 1990.

Robert says, "Join us for a glorious autumn tour of the Canadian Maritimes by train or plane and bus and ferryboat, timed perfectly to coincide with Celtic Colours 2013, one of the world's great traditional music festivals, staged in venues large and small all over Cape Breton each October."

DEPARTURE DAY: Wednesday, October 9: 2013

Depart from Montreal at 12:00 p.m. to Halifax on the overnight train in twin cabins with upper and lower beds.

Note: Flights can be arranged from Montreal to Halifax

Day 1: Thursday October 10: Arrival, Halifax

Travelers will arrive by train in the late afternoon (approximately 5:00 p.m.) in Halifax, Nova Scotia. We'll meet our coach and local guide then transfer to our downtown hotel for the evening. A welcome dinner is planned this evening for us at the hotel.

Day 2: Friday, October 11: Cape Breton - Celtic Colours Festival

Enjoy a leisurely morning. Afterward we'll travel past communities like Truro and Antigonish and cross the Canso Causeway to Cape Breton Island – where French, Scottish and Mi'kmaq cultures all come together. Cape Breton's most famous resident, Alexander Graham Bell, once said, "I have traveled around the globe. I have seen the Canadian and American Rockies, the Andes, the Alps and the Highlands of Scotland, but for simple beauty, Cape Breton outrivals them all." This evening, we'll attend the opening concert of Celtic Colours Festival at the Port Hawkesbury Civic Centre.

Day 3: Saturday, October 12: Cape Breton - Celtic Colours Festival

This morning we'll participate in one of the Celtic Colours community events. Local area weavers guild and quilt guild have teamed up on a massive display of works. The event offers sales of handcrafts by local artists working in fiber with demonstrations for the public.

This afternoon there is the option to attend Open Stage at the Bras d'Or Yacht Club in Baddeck. Musicians and listeners are invited to an informal afternoon to share tunes and songs. Please feel free to bring your instruments! This event is held on the waterfront in Baddeck overlooking Kidston Island.

Or later this afternoon, we'll step back in time to 1744 with a visit to the Fortress of Louisburg, the largest reconstructed 18th-century French fortified town in North America. We'll enjoy a guided tour of the fortress and learn of the struggle between the French and the English for control of this area. This evening, attend a Celtic Colours Festival concert at the Joan Harris Cruise Pavilion in Sydney.

Day 4: Sunday, October 13: Cape Breton - Celtic Colours Festival

After breakfast we'll attend one of the Celtic Colour community events this morning. Period instrument makers will be on hand with their guitars, fiddles, harps, whistles, and flutes. This is a unique opportunity to see how an instrument is made, and engage in conversation about the process.

This afternoon we'll attend a Celtic Colours Concert at the Gaelic College in St. Ann followed by a traditional Canadian Thanksgiving Dinner with a home cooked dinner of roast turkey, mashed potatoes and all the trimmings. Return to our accommodations for the evening.

Day 5: Monday, October 14: Cabot Trail (Canada Thanksgiving Day)

Today we'll have a full day to explore the incredible beauty of Cape Breton. We'll drive the 186-mile route which makes up the famous Cabot Trail, and travel through the Cape Breton Highlands National Park to visit the intriguing village of Cheticamp, famous for its crafts and Acadian culture. We plan to attend a Celtic concert this evening in Sydney. Meals: Breakfast, Boxed Lunch Overnight: Baddeck or nearby



Day 6: Tuesday, October 15: Prince Edward Island

After breakfast we'll bid farewell to Nova Scotia. We'll board the 75-minute ferry across the Northumberland Strait to Canada's smallest province – Prince Edward Island. You will be captivated during your visit to this island shaped by the sea. Upon arrival we'll enjoy an orientation tour of Charlottetown, the official birthplace of Canada. Afterward we'll check in to our hotel and end the day with a Maritime tradition-lobster supper.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner Overnight: Charlottetown

Day 7: Wednesday, October 16: Prince Edward Island

We'll begin our day with a walking tour of Charlottetown. Afterward we'll take time for lunch and then board the coach for an afternoon of exploring more of the island. We'll visit Green Gables, made famous around the world as the inspiration for the setting of the classic fiction, *Anne of Green Gables*. We'll see Prince Edward Island National Park, which is renowned for its red sandstone cliffs, fine white sand beaches and dunes, and lush green fields. We'll pay a visit to Prince Edward Island Preserve Company, recognized as Canada's finest maker of preserves, made primarily from quality island fruit. Sample many of their tasty wares and take home a bottle of preserves as a special souvenir. We'll return to Charlottetown for the evening.

Overnight: Charlottetown





Day 8: Thursday, October 17: Moncton

This morning after breakfast we'll travel across the Northumberland Strait, this time by the Confederation Bridge, an eight-mile-long engineering wonder. We'll enjoy a guided visit to the magnificently eroded Hopewell Rocks in the Bay of Fundy, site of the world's highest tides. Then we'll visit another natural phenomenon, the roiling waters of the Reversing Falls in the St. John River which we'll see from a scenic viewpoint. Tonight a festive farewell dinner is planned with Robert Resnik. Meals: Breakfast, Farewell Dinner

Overnight: Moncton

Day 9: Friday, October 18: Departure Day

This morning we'll spend time at leisure exploring Moncton before our afternoon departure by train or flight from Moncton.

Note: flights can also be arranged from the Moncton Airport with afternoon and evening departures.


Reservation Procedure
