WEDNESDAY, MAY 20 LONDON

After landing in London and clearing customs, meet our private guide and board the



meet our private guide and board the coach. We'll travel directly to our first garden, the Royal Horticultural Society's Garden at Wisley. We'll enjoy tea and scones before we begin the tour. This 250-acre garden captures the imagination with richly planted perennial borders, luscious rose gardens, and new state-of-the-art Glasshouse. It also features trial



gardens with new varieties of vegetables and flowers and model gardens that offer solutions for a variety of landscape circumstances and situations. Afterward we'll depart for our London hotel and check in. In the evening, we'll gather in the hotel restaurant for dinner.

THURSDAY, MAY 21 THE CHELSEA FLOWER SHOW

Today we'll have the entire day to enjoy the internationally famed RHS Chelsea Flower Show. The Holy Grail for gardeners, this is the most famous garden show in the world and signals the beginning of the summer garden season in England. Each year celebrities, royalty, and gardeners visit the demonstration gardens that feature more than 60 show gardens, floral art displays, fully designed gardens, and more than 600 vendors in the trade show area. Tonight you have the option of experiencing London entertainment, choosing between theater, musicals, opera, and classical music. *Breakfast*. Overnight London

FRIDAY, MAY 22 BATH ~ RIVERFORD ORGANIC FARM IN BUCKFASTLEIGH

This morning we leave London and travel west to Bath, a spa town which has been well known for its natural hot

springs since the Roman era. The fashion of "taking the waters" was revived during the Regency era and many of the finest houses, streets and parks date from that period. Visit the Roman Baths and Pump Room and see Bath Abbey, the Royal Crescent and Queen's Square.

Following our visit, we'll travel to Devon, stopping to visit the Riverford Organic Farm. Guy Watson and his family have been farming organically for more than 20 years, growing more than 85 different varieties of vegetables. The gardeners will describe their unique home-delivery system. We'll take a tractor and trailer ride through the farm over the beautiful rolling countryside, sampling seasonal vegetables as we go.



We'll then depart for the charming market town of Tavistock, located on the River

Tavy below the slopes of Dartmoor National Park. This delightful town with its pleasing architecture is well situated to



all of our garden visits for the next three days. The history of Tavistock stretches back over 1000 years to the founding of a Benedictine Abbey in 974 A.D. Once the largest and wealthiest abbey in Southwest England, the Abbey was dissolved in the 16th century and given to the Russell family, the future Dukes of Bedford. It is to the 7th Duke of Bedford that Tavistock owes its present form. Putting his wealth to good use, he became Tavistock's greatest benefactor, funding extensive town restoration and building houses for the workers. As such, Bedford Square, the Pannier Market and the Town Hall are all the Duke's work, marked by his signature, an engraved letter B. The market was chartered in 1105 and is now held here every day of the week offering a variety of local produce, antiques and crafts. After checking in, we'll dine together at our

hotel. Breakfast, Dinner. Overnight Tavistock



SATURDAY, MAY 23 GARDEN HOUSE ~ ROSEMOOR GARDENS

This morning after breakfast, we head south to Yelverton and visit the Garden House. This elegant former home of the vicars of Buckland Monachorum dates from the early 19th century. Its gem of a garden is off the beaten path and features beautiful views of the surrounding countryside. We'll explore the 10-acre garden, actually several gardens in



one. The highlight is the beautiful 2-acre Walled Garden surrounding the ruins of Buckland's 16th century vicarage. The garden has a huge selection of shrubs and herbaceous perennial plants.

We'll then travel to the beautiful Torridge Valley to visit Rosemoor Gardens. Another Royal Horticultural Society garden, Rosemoor spans 65 acres and has 3500 plants. Enjoy the stunning gardens such as Lady Anne Berry's original garden, arboretum, foliage garden, Mediterranean and semi-tropical garden, water garden, cottage garden, and more. After the visit, we'll return to Tavistock, where we'll have the evening free to dine at leisure in one of the

local pubs. Nothing better represents the spirit of the English than the pub. Not a mere tavern or restaurant, the pub represents a connection to the community as well as to one's ancestors. Indeed, some pubs are older than the town's churches. Count on a good pint, no-nonsense food and great story-telling. No one is a stranger!

SUNDAY, MAY 24 EDEN PROJECT

After breakfast, we'll travel to Cornwall and visit the Eden Project, which was envisioned in 1995 by Tim Smit

and opened to the public in 2001. The Project showcases over 100,000 plants from around the world in two giant transparent domes, each recreating different climate conditions. The world's largest multi-domed greenhouses recreate the natural environment of tropical rainforests in South America and Africa, temperate regions with distinct seasons like the Mediterranean and California, Chile and the Himalayas. Outside the domes are landscaped gardens and educational walks. On a Sunday afternoon in the gardens of Cornwall, the cares of the world slip away. The beauty of the horticultural world here spans so many varieties, you'll understand why this is called Eden. At the end of the day, compare notes with fellow travelers and hear what marvels were discovered in the gardens.

MONDAY, MAY 25 LOST GARDENS OF HELIGAN ~ MEVAGISSEY

Today we'll drive to the nearby Lost Gardens of Heligan. Created mainly in the 1800s, this garden was abandoned for decades until being recently rediscovered and renovated. One of the finest 19th century estate gardens in England, Heligan features 57 acres of planted gardens and 100 acres of ornamental woodlands, with follies and temples scattered throughout. Today the grounds include a complex of walled gardens and a huge vegetable garden. Afterward we'll visit the working fishing village of Mevagissey and stroll along the Coastal Walk. This village, which has changed little over the years, features tiny medieval streets and cob and slate buildings. Venture on the famous Cornwall Coastal Walk for picturesque views of the harbor, village, and shoreline. After our visits, we return to our hotel to relax and dine at leisure in town. *Breakfast*. Overnight Tavistock

Tuesday, May 26 Stonehenge ~ Wilton House Garden Centre

This morning after breakfast we'll check out and board our coach and travel to Stonehenge, one of Britain's most important prehistoric monuments. This huge megalithic structure, probably of religious significance, was erected about 5,000 years ago. We will continue our journey and visit the Wilton House Garden Centre. Set in the stunning gardens of Wilton House in Salisbury, the garden center features a broad selection of plants, seeds, bulbs, tools, and garden products along with beautiful display gardens. We'll travel to Windsor, check into our hotel and enjoy our final evening together at a farewell dinner. *Breakfast, Dinner*. Overnight Windsor

After breakfast we check out of our hotel and depart for the airport.
